<u> Training -</u>

We had one candidate whose license expired and took advantage of the recent rule change to get back into ham radio. This is a great development for someone whose life got in the way of their ham radio activities. As long as the individual had a General, Advanced or Extra class license and provide positive proof, they can reinstate their license by taking the current Technician exam.

We look forward to hearing our recent graduates on the air later this month and early next year.

Our next class is scheduled for March 3 through May 5, 2015.

<u>Contests -</u>

December 13 and 14 – ARRL 10 meter contest, CW and SSB. Exchange is RST and state. DC counts as a state for this contest. This is a great one for Technicians because they have CW privileges from 28.000 to 28.300 MHz and SSB privileges from 28.300 to 28.500 MHz. Many DX stations will be operating in the SSB portion to work US Technician Class operators.

December 21 – ARRL Rookie Roundup, CW. The exchange is your name and the 2 digit year you were first licensed. Rookies count 2 points and non-rookies count 1 point. A rookie is a ham licensed less than 1 year.

December 27 – Radio Amateurs Canada Winter Contest – Exchange for non-Canadian stations is RST and a serial number.



January 3 and 4 – ARRL RTTY Roundup. Exchange is RST and state.

Club Repeaters -

The Alexandria Radio Club owns more repeaters than other clubs in the area. We have repeaters on every ham radio band between 6 meters and 23 cm. Here is a great opportunity to try a new band. With the exception of the 23 cm repeater, all our repeaters are commercial grade equipment which should run for many years with minimal work. The 23 cm repeater is constructed from 2 Yaesu 23 cm mobile radios with a controller in between. All the repeaters provide good coverage in Alexandria and the surrounding area.
