We had a great meeting with the INOVA Alexandria Hopital folks last week. New gear is being purchased so we can finally get a station in the hospital's EOC. We hope to install a D-Star dual band radio and remote it to the equipment we have on the roof. Due to the shielding in the hospital we may have to use D-Star handhelds for nets within the hospital, but we can also see if other bands will also work. We will try a drill later in the year to see what works best for linking points in the hospital. We also provide emergency connections to the city and to other agencies. The Hospital has backup systems for their phone system and there is a dedicated radio system to link the northern Virginia hospitals and the retirement homes, but we still provide a flexibility needed in an emergency.

The City is working on its new Emergency Operations Center and we will have one or two positions in the EOC with HF/VHF/UHF/D-Star and Packet capabilities.
