Ian provided a great deal of information to help and went one step further in demonstrated how to add the required contacts list to the radios and also provide those who have a CS750 with his code plug. Ian's presentation helped demystify DMR. I expect that someone will install a DMR repeater in the area soon and we can play with another mode.

<u>Hamfests –</u>

The next hamfest in our area is the Maryland FM Association's Memorial Day Hamfest at the Howard County Fairgrounds in West Friendship, MD on May 28, 2017. The fairgrounds are located just off I-70 at Routes 32 and 144. In fact, you can actually see the fairgrounds from I-70. Talk-in will be on the MFMA's 146.760 MHz repeater (PL 107.2 Hz).

The Manassas Hamfest and Maker Technology Show takes place on Sunday, June 4, 2017 at the Prince William County Fairgrounds. It's a short drive from Alexandria. Talk-in will be on the Olde Virginia Hams 2 meter and 70 cm repeaters, 146.970 and 442.200. Both use 100.0 Hz PL.

The Baltimore Amateur Radio Club's Father's Day Hamfest will be on June 18, 2017. Location is the Arcadia Volunteer Fire Company in Upperco, MD.

<u> Training -</u>

Contests -

May 13 and 14 – Arkansas Party. Exchange is RST and state.

June 3 and 4 – Alabama QSO Party. Exchange is name and state.

June 10 through 12 – ARRL June VHF Contest. 50 MHz and above. Exchange is 4 digit grid square. Most of us are in FM18.

While not a contest, don't forget the annual Armed Forces Day Crossband Test on May 13, 2017. It's one of the few exceptions in the FCC rules allowing us to communicate with stations in another radio service. There is no formal exchange other than a friendly conversation and exchange of signal reports. Many of the military operators are also hams themselves, so they tend to be very good at QSLing. Repeaters –

If you are a DSTAR user, don't forget you can link any of the 3 voice repeaters to any reflector. Before you link to another reflector, you will need to unlink the repeater and then link to the reflector or repeater of your choice. Reflector 62B is now listed as Virginia Permalink Repeaters. In the future, we will default to 62B. However, during Hamvention weekend, we have Marshall link one of our repeaters (2 meters or 70 cm) to 38C, the Dayton Hamvention Reflector.

The club repeaters are all up and running. Make 2017 the year you try a new band or mode.
