# Trailblazing Band Captain — Mr. Alex Lammers, KO4ZMC

When faced with an antenna that did not want to perform on Field Day, Alex worked diligently to troubleshoot the problem, ultimately getting the radio back on the air after several attempts by other more seasoned operators failed. Alex continued his hard charge working through the night to ensure he captured as many contacts as possible on both the 80M and 160M bands.



## Mr. CW — Mr. Ian Keith, N8IK

Ian worked diligently through the night to maximize the number of CW contacts made for Field Day. When the dust cleared at the end of the event, Ian led in all modes with over 250 CW QSOs.

#### Digital Star Award — Mr. Ian Keith, N8IK

Ian led the charge to get our digital radio repeaters back on the air after a failed DSL connection rendered our DStar and DMR radio systems unusable. He replaced the hardline

connection with wireless cell data connection that he was able to get established on the First Responder network, FIRSTNET.

## Tech Ingenuity and Advancement — Mr. Joe Porcelli, KT3I

Joe's knowledge and experience with computers and latest technology was crucial to the success of Field Day. He set up a local mesh network, allowing all logging computers to a realtime status of contacts made, ensuring no duplicates, but also providing other stations with contact info to ensure each station captured proper call sign and other data needed to complete a QSO. Additionally, he created a real-time dashboard, which enabled all persons onsite to see the updated stats on contacts made, number for each mode, and other info vital to the success of Field Day.





# Line Thrower Extraordinaire — Mr. Ryan Stinebiser, KO4EBY

Ryan's ability to throw an antenna line into a tree is uncanny. After several others had difficulty getting a line into a tree to set up the 15M antenna, Ryan threw a line and made the whole process look easy

The Man, The Myth, The Legend — Mr. Jay Orbin, KV3W Jay worked the 15M band for the entire operating period. He was one of very few stations that operated for the entire 24-hour period without a change in operator. His efforts using both Phone and Digital modes netted nearly 150 QSOs.

Sight & Sound Award — Mr. Richard Morani, KW4UJ Since the COVID crisis, Richard has worked tirelessly and consistently to ensure that the production of our monthly hybrid Club meetings occur without a hiccup. The video camera setup, wireless microphones, and speaker placement along with operation of the Zoom console all contribute a professional production where both the local audience and the remote participants can fully engage in the details of the meeting.



The Alexandria Radio Club (ARC) held an amateur radio exam session on Tuesday, Dec. 5, at the Alexandria Police Department. This test session was conducted for the students enrolled in the fall session of the Alexandria Radio Club FCC License School.

**Rich Adamy**-KA4GFY, the ARC Lead Volunteer Examiner, had a conflicting event and asked me to pinch hit for him and conduct a one-time only test session on his behalf.

Four candidates sat for amateur radio exams and all of them passed.

- 2. Derek Fossi earned his Technician (KQ4NAI)
- 3. Aaron Kahn earned his General (KQ4NAJ)
- 4. Jan Maas-KB2LRX upgraded to Extra
