
Last month, we conducted our first joint event with the Arlington Amateur Radio Club and the Pentagon Amateur Radio Club, and it was a great success. The event was a combined **Parks on the Air (POTA) and Jamboree on the Air (JOTA)** event which supported members activating / hunting POTA QSOs and an opportunity for the Scouts to get on the air to complete requirements for a Radio Merit badge. Three scouts were able to complete their requirements for the badge at this event. We setup multiple HF stations with different antennas as well as a VHF/UHF station supporting local communications and WINLINK demonstrations. The setting for the event was at the Columbia Island Marina, a facility with plenty of parking immediately adjacent to the radio operations area, restrooms and a small restaurant for burgers, crab cakes and pretty much anything else you might like to enjoy. The food is actually very good and the prices aren't bad either. This setup is a winner and we look forward to future joint POTA type events with the Arlington Amateur Radio Club at this location.

October also brought us the 49th running of the **Marine Corp Marathon**. Nearly a dozen ARC members volunteered to support amateur radio operations for this year's Marine Corp Marathon. Arriving to check-in at 3AM, I picked up my gallon Ziploc of snacks/water, an MRE, an event shirt and a wristband and drove off to Water Point 12. Despite a few challenges with local law enforcement's ability to tell time, I arrived unscathed at my assigned location at 0340 and began to assemble the radios that I would need for the event. Within the hour, the Marines from 8th and I arrived to begin setup of tables and

distribute the cases of cups while awaiting the Walmart tractor trailer hauling the water. Apparently there had been some sort of traffic issue on the road between the water warehouse and the Pentagon which caused the water to run late, so we waited. I made my introductions to the Marine lead for Water Point 12, a Marine Major, and then settled in to wait for the 0630 roll call. As the weather was perfect and one of our other members was basically just around the bend in North Parking, I sauntered over early to check-in with him. He was all setup with radios and speaker mics, a cooler, a folding chair and even a large standing umbrella. Now, this guy was really prepared! I will do better next year! Together Gary and I secured North Parking area for the entirety of the race and had no reportable issues beyond "first in category" reporting. Overall, there were only a couple of serious emergency type issues in this year's race with both individuals making full recoveries. Radio reception / transmission was generally good although there were a few spots where 5W just wasn't enough regardless of antenna but I believed we performed well on the overall and the Marine Corp Marathon organizers were very appreciative of the communication services we delivered. Perhaps we can get a few more of us out there next year in 2025!

Three Clubs Host JOTA/POTA Event

The Alexandria Radio Club (ARC) joined the Arlington Amateur Radio Club (ARRC) and the Pentagon Amateur Radio Club (PARC) in hosting a Parks on the Air session combined with a Jamboree on the Air for Scouts. It took place on Saturday, October 19, 2024, at Lady Bird Johnson Park/Columbia Island Marina along the Potomac River near the Pentagon.

Gary Sessums, KC5QCN, reports:

Jamboree on the Air, the largest Scouting event in the world, takes place annually during the third weekend of October to mentor Boy Scouts of all ages in the art and skill of amateur radio.

This annual global operating event allows Boy Scouts to use amateur radio to connect with hams around the world.

Club members set up portable operating gear, erected wire antennas in trees, and made HF radio contacts with JOTA stations located around the United States in addition to sending and receiving email messages over radio via Winlink.

Voice and digital amateur radio operations were conducted from picnic tables set up along the water's edge under the shade trees of the Potomac River, a class covering the basics of radio technology was held to assist Boy Scouts with radio merit badge requirements, and a free amateur radio exam session was offered.
