• **Jack's** activity took him far afield and into some interesting weather, as he reports here:

I operated as a single mobile operator. I began my operations close to home at the Chinquapin Park next to Alexandria City high school and worked my way down to the upper middle and western portion of the state over the two contest days. My route was filled with some beautiful sites of the countryside such as those seen in Madison, Page, Spotsylvania, and Orange counties to highlight a few. The bands were very noisy a good portion of the contest and especially the last couple of hours on Sunday with the thunderstorms coming though. Just as the contest ended and I began my

journey home from Frederick County, a larger than marble size hailstorm pounded my truck. However, my Chevy seemed to make it through with no hail damage! Otherwise, the weather was mildly cool and pleasant for the contest.
