ARC set up a Winter Field Day operation for Saturday, Jan. 24, at Alexandria Fire Station 210, on Eisenhower Ave. Members set up antennas, radio gear, and logging software, and made numerous contacts in different modes.

Lead organizer **Skip Dronen (KO2THF)** reports:

I wish I could thank everyone by name for planning, setting up, operating, and de-mobilizing our Winter Field Day Exercise. Frankly, it is just not possible. This was such a team effort; I would definitely miss someone if I tried to make that list.

Set-up on Friday and Saturday morning went very well. We were ready to operate an hour before the official start at 11:00 am. We were well fueled, dozens upon dozens of donated doughnuts, pastries, coffee and rhubarb pies! One new Ham Radio Technician was minted, and he operated for the first time that day. We had some fantastic technology demos with ARES, clear nodes, Winlink FM setups, etc. We even had three people try to squeeze in some End-Fed Halfwave antenna building.

More importantly, this club showed a tremendous amount of capability in both the art and science of radio. We literally operated on 12 bands, which was a tremendous accomplishment. We operated in SSB, CW, and Digital (I nabbed a JS8Call at the last minute). We copied the WFD Bulletin. We operated multiple stations on battery power. All while managing the minute to minute nature of a pending real world weather situation to ensure we didn't put our members and guests at risk.

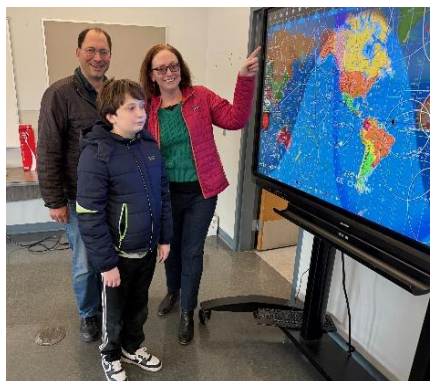
Like all events, we did some things well and could improve in other areas. If you have any constructive feedback, please send me a note and I'll add it to my notes.

1. For the January 9th meeting of the Alexandria Amateur Radio Club, 22 people were in attendance with 19 participating in the in-person meeting and 3 people in the online Zoom meeting.
2. Sean Gallagher, K4KBK, introduces Aaron Kahn, K6HLC, as president.
3. Visitor Introduction - Bert Flower, N1MXO, introduces himself to the club. His legal address is in New Hampshire but he is here doing some renovations on an apartment and found the club via the repeater.
4. General Member introductions around the room and on Zoom. Congrats to Larry, KQ4SBC, on his recent upgrade to General.
5. No certificates or special awards. Sean, K4KBK, mentions he has some Christmas Party awards that still need to be handed out.
6. Sean, K4KBK, will submit a written officer report to the club.
7. Aaron, K6HLC, begins "new business." A financial audit committee needs to be appointed to review the club financials and submit a report by next meeting per the bylaws.
8. Introduction of 2026 officers and board members:

9. Completed Club Tasks - Aaron, K6HLC, notified the club that the repeater trustee has been updated and the club call sign has been renewed. Skip, KO2THF is the new trustee.
10. Richard, KW4UJ, reviewed the club financials. A few specific items were discussed:
 - a. Treasurer report from 2025
 - i. Income: \$3,100
 - ii. Expenses: \$3,303
 - iii. 2025: Net loss \$ -196
 - b. Projected 2026
 - i. 2026 Project Income: \$3,134
 - ii. 2026 Project Expenses: \$3,354
 - iii. 2026 Project Net loss: \$ -220

- c. RE Winterfest Tables (2 @ \$30 ea) Bob, KO4ZIK, mentions he received an email saying tables are sold out. Sean, K4KBK, received an email yesterday (1/8) asking that if tables were not needed they could be given to other clubs/organizations. Bob, KO4ZIK, reminds club members he has 4 boxes of equipment from an SK estate sale that needs to be sold/donated. Bob will be onsite to administer tests and can bring equipment, but is leaving and won't be back in the area until February. Don, KI4D states the estate does not want the money from any sales and it would be a donation to the club. The club will keep the tables at Winterfest as they are already budgeted and in need.
 - d. Don, KI4D, asks why tax prep is included if we are becoming a 501c3. Richard, KW4UJ, mentions 2026 budget would be for tax year 2025.
 - e. Sandy, KQ4DNE, motions to vote to approve the budget. Sean, K4KBK, seconds. Hand vote is taken: 2026 Budget is passed.
11. ARRL section manager vote - Nominee: Mike Aimone. Aaron, K6HLC, asks Sean, K4KBK, for more details. Mike Aimone, WA8AHZ, is chairman of the board at Vienna Wireless Society. ARRL election must be received by Feb. Sean believes Mike, WA8AHZ, is the right choice. He is local and would be a great voice for the region.
12. Winter Field Day (WFD) Skip, KO2THF, gives update.
- a. Winter Field Day will be held on 1/24 and 1/25. Check reflector email for more detailed information on parking and setup times. If you want to bring your own equipment to test, feel free. We are operating 2 stations, so we need to coordinate who is transmitting. Aaron, K6HLC, has volunteered to call in on 2m / 70cm. Earlier warnings from the fire department are no longer valid. Joe P, KT3I, is working to stage fire equipment in other areas. Don, KI4D, asks about emergency power. We need 3 approvals to run on emergency power, we have 2 approvals. Sometime next week the decision will be made to run batteries/generators vs. emergency power.
 - b. Virtual training - Jan 20th, 8pm To set up logging software and JS8call using N3JFP.
 - c. Registering for dedicated time. Skip plans to invite other local clubs if they request dedicated time.
 - d. Roving mobile team.
 - e. Antenna display - ARES display.
 - f. Gary, KC5QCN, will be running a test session.
 - g. Bob, KO4ZIK, mentions if you are going to take a ham test, please pre-register so they have an idea of number.
13. Don, KI4D - Tomorrow Jan. 10th there will be a JS8call session. Joe P, KT3I, sent out email with details.
14. Ian, N8IK, mentions if you are a Tech you can still operate with oversight from a General or an Extra at Winter Field Day. Great opportunity to experience HF.

15. Bob, KO4ZIK, will be in California, spot via Discord and he will try to make contact.

16. Committee reports

- a. Membership Sandy, KQ4DNE- 4 New potential members sent postcard via mail.
- b. Public Affairs - Jan, KB2LRX
 - i. ARRL has designated 2026 as “Year of the Club,” and is sponsoring a club newsletter contest. Jan will be submitting our newsletter, ARC-SHORTS, along with a 500-word statement of purpose in hopes the letter will get selected. Richard, KW4UJ, will give Jan accurate club numbers for the entry form. Due Jan. 30th.
 - ii. ARRL Library Book sale – The club can donate 12 ARRL books to the Alexandria Library. Jan, KB2LRX, will contact the library about their interest in this program. If they want the books, we notify ARRL, which will send them directly. Jan mentions library has only 1 or 2 old ham radio books in their collection.
 - iii. World Amateur Radio Day - April 18th - could possibly set up trailer at library and combine with giving library books.
 - iv. Sean, K4KBK, mentions he has already been contacted to see if we will be submitting the Newsletter to the ARRL Year of the Club. Well done, Jan!
 - v. Don, KI4D, asks about US 250 - No current plans by Alexandria City.
- c. ARES - Allstar - Presentation moved to February. Joe K, KD2HZG. - Still doesn't have PoC at Em Center. Was asked by Joe P, KT3I, if he had hospital info. If anyone does, please reach out. Will have an Allstar node at Winter Field Day. Will be doing an Antenna display at Winter Field Day. Gary S., KC5QCN, and Ed, KQ4YGT, will have Allstar hotspots at Winter Field Day to demonstrate.
- d. Repeater: Ian, N8IK - all repeaters are good. Skip, KO2THF - We are forming a repeater committee to help with repeater relocation project to the new Inova hospital.
- e. EmComm - Stex, K4IEW, has been working on an EmComm presentation and will submit it to Aaron as new club president. Primarily used for schools to get interest and get new hams. He had the opportunity to attend a DMV EmComm meeting. His takeaway: continue to practice at things like Winter Field Day and Field Day so you can be prepared for emergency situations.
- f. Sandy, KQ4DNE - Feb. 12th Fairfax will be hosting a Skywarn class. Need to take class once every 3 years to stay current.
- g. Training & Testing: Richard, KW4UJ, will be working on the next class schedule. Gary, KC5QCN, mentions upcoming testing at Winter Field Day
- h. Trailer: Sean, K4KBK, is getting it ready for the events and parades. Maintenance check and clean up before events.

- i. Webmaster: Richard, KW4UJ, looking for suggestions and working on building a membership only section.
 - j. Social Media: No updates. Keep in mind Discord is not official club news. Official news will be delivered via Club Newsletter or Club Reflector.
 - k. Nets: Bryan, WD4ADF - Thanks club members for getting everything scheduled.
 - i. No new Net Control Class. Let's use what we have. If you want to jump in without taking the class, it is not a barrier to entry.
 - ii. Special Nets: Please send email to Bryan if you are interested. Special Nets won't be scheduled unless there is interest.
